






2023 Outcomes are SOARing!

Over the last 18 years, the SOAR model has been used to assist over 105,013 people who were experiencing or at risk of homelessness with applications for Supplemental Security Income (SSI) and/or Social Security Disability Insurance (SSDI), the two disability income benefit programs administered by the Social Security Administration (SSA).

In FY2023, there were 2,604 approvals on initial applications. Decisions on SOAR-assisted initial applications were received in an average of **167 days** with an allowance rate of **66 percent**.



The 2023 SOAR Outcomes Issue Brief highlights SOAR Super Stars that have been increasing their capacity, improving approval rates, and reducing the days to decisions on SOAR-assisted SSI/SSDI applications. Sharing Our Successes

SOAR Success in North Carolina

The following SOAR success story was submitted by Michelle Armstrong-Lavine, a SOAR-trained practitioner and SOAR Local Lead from Mecklenburg County CJS Forensic Evaluations Unit in Charlotte, North Carolina.

After serving eight and a half years in state prison, Will* was scheduled to be released on July 17, 2023. He was informed that he would be sent to Durham, North Carolina, rather than Charlotte, where he previously resided. Having no affiliation to or familiarity with Durham, this news sent Will into an immediate panic. He shared, "I didn't even know the name of one street in Durham, so I was wondering how I was going to survive there."

Plans changed in Will's favor, and he was instead referred to the Mecklenburg County Re-entry Program in Charlotte. He was immediately linked to a Re-entry case manager and reunited with his sister. The case manager reported that when he first met Will, he was "very distant, and skeptical about the Re-entry program" so he knew that he had to gain Will's trust by addressing his immediate needs. So, he linked Will to re-entry housing and referred him to the SOAR Program for assistance with applying for SSI/SSDI benefits.

The SOAR Coordinator collaborated with his case manager and sister to initiate the SSI/SSDI application process. She encountered a barrier when Will's sister shared that Will was listed as deceased in the Social Security system and she had no success with correcting the error. Fortunately, she was able to provide the documents needed to prove that Will was not deceased, and the issue was quickly resolved with the assistance of the Social Security SOAR liaison.

Will was awarded SSI benefits on September 29, 2023 - only 59 days after the application was submitted. He immediately began receiving \$914 monthly and received a retroactive payment for the month of August. This achievement was only possible due to the collaboration of the individuals who were invested in assessing and addressing Will's immediate needs.

Will now independently pays for his housing and is working with his case manager and the Coordinated Entry Program to secure housing that is more medically appropriate. He also has Medicaid and is receiving the medical treatment that he needs. During his recent presentation at the SOAR State Team Leadership Academy, Will shared that the greatest benefit of working with the Re-Entry and SOAR Programs was that he "got his freedom back." He also expressed his gratitude to all the SOAR case managers and other professionals that support individuals who are released from incarceration. He said his hope is "to be able to give back one day."




- **Colorado:** Bayaud Enterprises *Navigator II -Benefits Navigator (Full -time):* Assist in SSI/SSDI benefit acquisition utilizing SOAR model principles.
- **Maryland:** Health Care for the Homeless *Disability Assistance Outreach Specialist (Full-time):* Submit SSI/SSDI applications using the SOAR model for severely, chronically mentally ill individuals who are experiencing homelessness in Baltimore City.
- **New Mexico:** Heading Home *SOAR Specialist Contractor (Part-time):* Work on a contract basis as a SOAR Specialist using the SOAR model to assist clients experiencing or at risk of homelessness who are in need of disability benefits. As this is a semi-remote position, an ideal contractor can work under minimal supervision and is self-motivated.
- **Virginia:** Micah Ecumenical Ministries *SOAR Coordinator*: This is a full-time position responsible to the Income Navigator. Most individuals served are enrolled in one of Micah's housing programs. This position has a focus on submitting high-quality Social Security benefits applications using the SOAR model.
